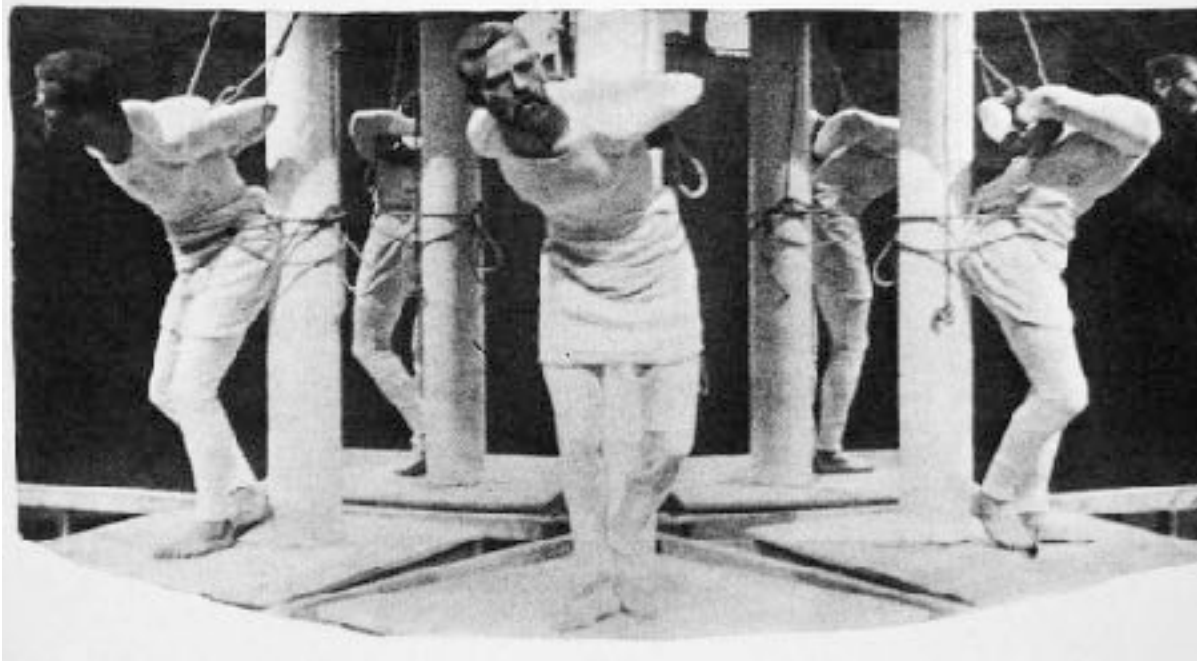

An historical look at the work of the Catalan architect Antoni Gaudi (1852 – 1926) who is most famous these days for his design of the *Basilica and Expiatory Temple of the Holy Family*, commonly known as the *Sagrada Famillia*, in Barcelona. This presentation will focus on a particular period, late in Gaudi's life, that fundamentally changed his architectural practice and methods of working — a change that, long after his death and the destruction of nearly all of his models and drawings, made possible the unlikely completion of the *Sagrada Famillia* in the 21st Century.
